1. Caribbean descent through birth or heritage, i.e. parent(s) or grandparent(s).
2. Be a college enrollee in, or a high school graduate or graduating high school senior accepted in, a matriculated undergraduate program at 1) an accredited college or university in the USA, 2) the University of the West Indies or one of its Affiliates, or 3) a Caribbean Community College.
3. One faculty recommendation (see CAMSA Scholarship application).
4. One community recommendation from an adult not related to applicant (see CAMSA Scholarship application).
5. Transcript (high school or college as applicable)
6. A one page double spaced essay.
7. Biographical sketch.
8. Intent to pursue a degree in the natural or health sciences.
